## TEMPLE COMPANIONS


In a 2017 RootsTech session, Elder Erich W. Kopischke, a General Authority Seventy, told a story about a young woman who approached him after a church meeting and spoke of a deceased ancestor, saying: "I love my great grandmother. I just went with her to the temple, and the two of us, we had a great time."

This brief anecdote has caused me to reflect on temple companions and what kinds of experiences we can have with them. I have memories spanning from my youth to just this morning of going to the temple with friends or family members and being strengthened together in temple service. Whether it is with an old friend or a new friend – perhaps a new convert – we can strengthen our kinship with our brothers and sisters in the gospel as we participate together in temple work. As a husband and father, some of my treasured memories are of times I have been able to be in the temple with my wife and children.

The story told by Elder Kopischke provides thoughtful perspective. We have the opportunity not only to take a name to the temple for a deceased ancestor, but to share that experience with them. The young woman in the story had – spiritually – eyes to see and ears to hear. Through the Holy Ghost, she was able to create a bond with her great grandmother as she performed ordinances on her behalf.

In the recent (October 2024) General Conference, President Russell M. Nelson explained that we have the opportunity to have another temple companion. He said:

"Brothers and sisters, now is the time for you and for me to prepare for the Second Coming of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ. Now is the time for us to make our discipleship our highest priority. In a world filled with dizzying distractions, how can we do this?



"Regular worship in the temple will help us. In the house of the Lord, we focus on Jesus Christ. We learn of Him. We make covenants to follow Him. We come to know Him. As we keep our temple covenants, we gain greater access to the Lord's strengthening power. In the temple, we receive protection from the buffetings of the world. We experience the pure love of Jesus Christ and our Heavenly Father in great abundance! We feel peace and spiritual reassurance, in contrast to the turbulence of the world.

"Here is my promise to you: Every sincere seeker of Jesus Christ will find Him in the temple. You will feel His mercy. You will find answers to your most vexing questions. You will better comprehend the joy of His gospel."

I invite you to create meaningful experiences with temple companions and strengthen connections with friends, living family, ancestors, and our Savior, Jesus Christ.

- Pre-Registration (Oct 22, 2024 Jan 14, 2025): No advantage for early vs. late; all must complete by Jan 14.
- Pre-Registration Finalization (Jan 16 Jan 29, 2025): Session assignments announced. Finalize or decline; unfinalized spots forfeit.
- Priority Registration (Jan 30 Feb 12, 2025): Youth who didn't finalize or didn't receive an assignment can register for their stake's sessions. Registered youth may transfer.
- Standard Registration (Feb 13 Feb 26, 2025): All approved youth can register or transfer within their stake's assigned sessions.
- Open Registration (Begins Feb 27, 2025): Youth can register for any available spot in their country.
- Off-Cycle Registration (Begins Mar 13, 2025): Limited availability; on-cycle youth should register before this date.


