
YOUTH & YSA VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

TEMPLE & FAMILY HISTORY MESSAGE

A few weeks ago, I went to my dentist for a six-month checkup. After a thorough exam, I left the chair with a clean bill of health—no cavities! At the receptionist's desk, she gave me a thumbs-up and asked, "Shall we schedule your next appointment?" Naturally, I said yes.

We make appointments to reserve time in advance for things we prioritize: doctor visits, exams, lunch dates, car maintenance, youth sports, and parent-teacher meetings. Here's a question: are you also making a regular appointment with the Lord in His house?

In October 2018 General Conference, President Nelson urged, "If you have reasonable access to a temple, I urge you to find a way to make an appointment regularly with the Lord—to be in His holy house—then keep that appointment with exactness and joy."


While Church leaders don't set quotas for temple attendance, we can set personal goals. Many years ago, a ward leader challenged me to set a personal goal for temple visits throughout the year. I prayed about it and chose a goal that felt both achievable and spiritually meaningful.

To reach my goal, I had to be intentional about scheduling time to go. This meant making an appointment with my Heavenly Father to visit His house - and putting it on my calendar! The more regular my visits became, the more I thought about the temple, and it soon felt like much more than a duty. Despite travel and other commitments, I found creative ways to keep my appointments in the temple. Over time, each visit became a spiritual investment in my relationship with my Heavenly Father.

During the same October 2018 General Conference, Elder Renlund described blessings that come from participating in temple and family history work. Here's a reminder of what those blessings include:

- Assistance to mend troubled, broken or anxious hearts
- The ability to no longer feel alone
- Increased love for others, especially your family members living and dead
- Power to discern
- Greater influence of the Holy Ghost to feel direction in life
- Increased ability to repent and protection from temptation
- Refinement and sanctification of one's heart
- Increased family blessings, no matter one's current, past, or future family situation or how imperfect one's family tree may be
- Deep and abiding conversion to the Savior through increased faith in Him and a better understanding of His atonement
- And, increased joy through an increased ability to feel the love of the Lord

These blessings are real, available to each of us as children of Heavenly Father, and come as we prioritize our appointments with the Lord in His house.
